The Benefield Parish Council is here to serve our community and to help to maintain the appearance, safety, and wellbeing of the village. To this end, in 2024 we ensured that the grass verges received a regular cut. Hedges and footpaths were kept clear. Road signs are visible and kept clear of undergrowth. We also held our annual litter pick. These are all ongoing events which we commit to for this year.

Speeding traffic and the need for speed cameras has been high on the agenda for some time. We are pleased to say that progress has been made regarding installing speed cameras. This has been a long process, but we are nearly there and will keep you updated as events progress.

A request was made that a further bus shelter is installed in Upper and a new one in Lower. This is a work in progress and again we will keep you informed.

The Parish Council are also responsible for a number of other things such as lighting, general maintenance, audits, insurance, the Clerk's salary, the Remembrance Sunday wreaths, and the funding of new projects. We therefore work to a strict budget. We received a small percentage of the Council Tax you pay and this is termed as the Precept. This on average has been about £43 per household per year and has been held at that amount for the last few years. However, with rising costs, such as our electricity bills for the village street lighting it was agreed at the last Council meeting to increase the precept to £55 per household. This may seem a big increase, but it only works out at 23p per week and the whole Precept at a little over £1.00 per week per household.

We will endeavour to spend and invest this wisely.

Please take pride in the village. We can all do our bit to maintain the good appearance and the wellbeing and safety of the village.

Here are a few tips and some do's and don'ts.

Footpaths and hedges Hard surface paths that run through the village should be always kept clear.

Please avoid parking on the footpaths.

Bins must be removed once the Council have emptied these. Please do not leave them on the footpath.

If something has spilt from the bin, then please pick it up. Remember that if we all keep a clean step, we have a tidy street.

If you have a hedge or plants that boarders the path, please ensure that these do not encroach or overgrow the path. A good rule of thumb is to consider whether a pushchair or mobility scooter could safely pass without having to use the busy road.

Grass cutting The Parish Council arrange for regular cuts. We would like to thank those residents who nevertheless cut the grass outside of their own property and we would encourage this to continue.

Dog fouling The majority of dog walkers pick up and safely dispose of the waste. However, there are some who do not. Dog fouling spoils the environment, upsets residents and can cause serious health risks particularly to children and the elderly. It is a criminal offence not to pick up and dispose of the waste. This includes all public footpaths whether they are hard surface or grassed. A particular concern is the mess left on the cricket field.

St Mary's Church, Benefield is an important church in the context of the history of church building, with its restoration in 1846-47 being in an Anglo-Catholic style it was described as "an important specimen of a sumptuous Tractarian church".

There has been a church on the site since at least the fourteenth century, the chancel dates from this time but was altered when JM Derrick restored and rebuilt parts of the church for the Watts Russell family in 1847.

The church was further enhanced by Sir Ninian Comper in 1897, when the altar and rood screen were installed, the chancel was decorated, the organ moved, and mediaeval misericords were brought from Tansor church.

There are 6 bells in the spire which were refurbished and rehung 20 years ago, visiting bell ringers ring them from time to time and they are often rung after weddings.

We have services on the first and third Sunday of the month at 9.15 am and throughout the year also celebrate various festivals- Easter, Harvest, Christmas, please join us, you will be given a warm welcome.

It is your village church for christenings, weddings, funerals and burials of Benefield residents.

The church is run by the PCC- Parochial Church Council, village volunteers who are responsible for all the fundraising and upkeep of the church and churchyard. Brian Bullimore and Alan Rayden have looked after the churchyard for the last 10 years cutting and strimming all the grass, thank you both for all your hard work. In the spring we will have working party to tidy parts of the church yard, volunteers will be very welcome.

The church roof is Collyweston, the chancel roof was repaired 25 years ago and 8 years ago the south isle roof was stripped and repaired with the help of grant funding. We are now about to embark on fundraising and grant applications to repair the roof on the north aisle and main part of the church, if anyone has any ideas for this please let me know, any help would be much appreciated.

A game of Play Your Cards Right with a cash prize is planned.






SUMMER BBQs. Fridays weather permitting. We plan to have at least one per month during **June**, **July** and **August**. Volunteers will be needed to help with this.

The 2024 season was reasonably successful – we played 13 matches winning 6 and losing 7 with 1 match cancelled due to rain and 2 matches conceded due to not being able to field a side which is always disappointing. However, we have had a welcome influx of a few new players who hopefully will continue with us next year. Many thanks go to the ground staff (Alf & Keith) who produced another year of excellent pitches. Above all, the team and spectators enjoyed the matches played.

A couple memorable matches were very close, with Benefield winning by 8 runs against Nassington (Benefield 182 all out, and Nassington bowled out for 174), and an even closer 1 run win over Upwood (Benefield 127 and bowled Upwood out for 126). Young Sam Levick scored 51 not out and then bowled 5 overs taking 5 wickets for 18 runs. The players and crowd were well entertained.

Overall the top run scorers and wicket takers were Dan Blatch, Johnny Ironmonger and Sam Levick with useful contributions from Simon Pollack and Matt Howell during the season.

Last year we had the sad passing of Colin Nicholls. Colin played and was groundsman at Benefield for many years and his ashes are scattered over his beloved cricket pitch. Our clubhouse bears his name.

The 2025 season starts at the end of April -fixtures are due out soon. We welcome anyone with interest in playing irrespective of age, sex or competence. 
