

The 2025 season was notable for the runs and wickets being spread around the team. However, John Ironmonger had a great season with bat and ball scoring 592 runs (average of 74 and including 1 century) and taking 19 wickets (including 6 wickets for 9 runs). Other batters included Harry Chudley scoring 399 runs (including I century), Sam Levick 278, Robbie Head 183 (6 innings but only out



Whilst we are often told that Clark Gable was stationed at Polebrook during WW2 we had our own celebrity visiting closer to home at Christmas 1944— Marlene Dietrich entertained the troops.



Although Marlene Dietrich was born in Berlin, she moved to the USA in 1930 and in 1939 she became an American citizen and renounced her German citizenship.

There were nearly 3,000 Americans stationed at Deenethorpe airbase during the war. It is said that local women did the laundry for the airmen and ground crews. In return, the airmen

would often take kit bags full of food and supplies to the locals whom they knew from the laundry operations, or from their visits to the local pubs.



Also, it was not uncommon for the quartermaster to dispose of unopened cans of food in the local refuse tip to make room for the next shipment. The guards would "turn a blind eye" so local villagers could help themselves.

As shown in the photo, airmen and support personnel rode bicycles to get to the

Wheatsheaf pub in Upper Benefield, or the Cardigan Arms in Deenethorpe. The Wheatsheaf, built in the 17th century, is still there, but is no longer a pub. The Cardigan Arms has also closed.
